





My sisters and brothers, this is the day the Lord has made: let us rejoice and celebrate with joy. Our Lenten fasting is over! We have flowers at the sanctuary, we sing Glory to God and Alleluia in our celebration of Jesus' victory.

Today we are filled with Easter joy and peace; our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ is risen! Christ has conquered death and unlocked for us the door to everlasting life. We are happy, during Easter as we celebrate Jesus' glory of resurrection, but also our own share in it because by dying He has destroyed our death, and by rising restored our life. We rejoice for Jesus' infinite love for humankind, but also our call to love as Jesus did. We are glad evil has given way to goodness; bondage to freedom; despair to hope; darkness to light and death to life.

Jesus death and resurrection is proof that where there is love sacrifice is easy. For the resurrection is the victory of self-sacrificing love. This love is so impelling that when we are touched by it we can't help but reach out to others with the same self-sacrificing love. "Love and do what you will" says St. Augustine. As the angel told the women at the tomb, so is God's message for us today: "Do not be afraid." Through our pain and sacrifices, through our hopes and dreams, God is ever present at our side, to see us through to victory like Jesus on Easter Sunday.

Easter changed everything. If Jesus did not rise form the dead, we would not care about His birth. Jesus' resurrection is proof that He is the Lord of life. Because of His victory, death has no power over us. Hence our faith in Jesus Christ and preaching about Him is not in vain. St. Paul in I Corinthians 15:14 says, "If Christ has not been raised, then empty is our preaching, empty, too is your faith." But now Christ has been raised from the dead. Hence, we preach and so you believe. And since you believe, you are called to share the good news as witnesses of the risen Lord.

Tell the people that an empty tomb is there to prove our Lord and Savior lives. And because He lives, we can now face the future with hope. As we celebrate this Jubilee Year, we are reminded that we are Pilgrims of Hope together in prayer.




