

Dear editor, can the Saints in Heaven pray for the souls in Purgatory, and thus help them get to Heaven sooner?

Dear reader, the question is very apt as we are in the season of Easter, celebrating the Resurrection of Christ. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CCC) teaches that "by his death and Resurrection, Jesus Christ has "opened" heaven to us. The life of the blessed consists in the full and perfect possession of the fruits of the redemption accomplished by Christ...Heaven is the Blessed community of all who are perfectly incorporated into Christ" (n. 1027). In Heaven, the saints experience the Beatific Vision, where they 'see' God 'face to face.' Their joy will be complete at the *Parousia*, when Christ comes again, then we all shall experience the resurrection, whereby our bodies will be reunited with our souls.

In Purgatory, "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of Heaven" (CCC n. 1030). We cannot enter Heaven with any stain of sin. Purgatory purifies the soul before it 'enters' Heaven. We can certainly implore the help of the saints to intercede for a soul in Purgatory. When someone on earth requests a saint's intercession for a particular soul, the saints in Heaven intercede for the souls in Purgatory in those cases. The Church invokes the saints during the saints during the Rite of Final Commendation, usually at the graveside, during a burial of a Christian: "saints of God come to his/her aid! Come to meet him/her angels of God."

It is important to note that, except when a saint has been formally canonized, we do not know if our loved one who has passed is in Heaven, Purgatory or hell. If the person is in Heaven, he/she has no need of our prayers. When we pray for the dead, we pray for the souls in purgatory. All we can do is to entrust the faithful departed to God's Mercy through our constant prayers for the dead and asking the saints in Heaven to intercede for the soul in purgatory. In addition to praying for a soul in Purgatory, the Church also recommends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead (CCC n. 1032).

# Watson, Eliza G. <a href="Wisdom's Daughters">Wisdom's Daughters</a> (Stories of Women around Jesus)

Ms. Watson tells the story of Jesus through the real and imagined accounts of fourteen women, using the first person to tell their stories. These women include Elizabeth; the woman at the well; Simon Peter's mother-in-law; Mary Magdalene; and Mary, the mother of Jesus. The women step forth from the pages of the Gospels as real persons whose lives were forever changed by their contacts with Jesus. Like the woman referred to only as the "bent-over woman," we sing songs of joy when Jesus calls us to Him, no matter what affliction we might suffer. Like the woman who anointed Jesus before His burial, we hope to show courage and compassion, even when others show none. 


