Dear editor, what does the term 'marriage consent' mean and what does it imply in a sacramental marriage?

Consent is the agreement between a man and a woman to enter into a marriage 'for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, till death do us part.' It refers to the exchange of promises during the wedding ceremony which gives the couple the opportunity to say yes to each other publicly. Consent is an act of total trust in one's partner; an act of love and an unconditional acceptance of the other as a whole being: 'a commitment to a very special form of friendship in which the husband and the wife generously share everything, allowing no unreasonable exceptions or thinking just of their own interests.'

Marriage consent therefore points beyond itself and manifests the saving love of Christ for his Church. According to Pope Pius XI, the moment of consent is a sacrament, but the married life is also a sacramental and a sign of Christ's love. Pope John Paul II teaches that 'The couple are called to live the very charity of Christ who gave himself up on the cross' (Familiaris Consortio n. 12). In the Latin Church where we belong, the ministers of the Sacrament of marriage are the couple themselves. This teaching flows from their baptismal dignity and their participation in the priesthood of Christ. The couple mutually confer upon each other the sacrament of marriage through expressing their consent before the Church. In summary, when a couple pronounce their marriage vows, we presume they mean what they say, and when they present themselves in Church to marry, we presume they intend to do what the Church understands by marriage.

There must be some observable signs that consent is given. Usually, this is done by the couple reciting their marriage vows. However, it can also be expressed in sign language or by other gestures. The main thing is that consent must be clearly given. The public character of the consent protects the 'I do' once given and helps the spouses remain faithful to it (*Catechism of the Catholic Church* n. 1631)




