





Day in the life of St. Paul's Ministries

Greeters Ministry

Hi – my name is Patrice and I have been a member of the Greeter Ministry team for about a year. About once a month I am scheduled to be a greeter at one of the weekend Masses. I arrive about twenty minutes before the start of Mass and am located either at the front door (Narthex) or the side door (East entrance) to be a welcoming friendly face to Mass attendees. I assist as needed with helping people at the door, out of their car or can be an extra hand for carrying in donations. After Mass, I cheerfully distribute the weekly bulletin to people as they leave Mass.

There are also additional opportunities for me to volunteer outside of my scheduled weekend Mass if I desire. These include being a Greeter for holiday, holy day and funeral Masses and sometimes other special event Masses like Confirmation. Occasionally, there may be other parish activities such as the summer picnic, coffee hour, and ministry fairs where Greeters are asked to assist.

Forest Shick is our ministry coordinator and does a great job with creating and maintaining the schedule, sending us weekly reminders, and communicating and coordinating the need for volunteers in advance of any special events.

St. Paul's Question of the Week

Dear editor, what are the Corporal Works of Mercy?

Dear reader, the Corporal Works of Mercy are found in the teachings of Jesus and give us a model for how we should treat all others, as if they were Christ in disguise. The word 'corporal' comes from the Latin *corpus* which means body. The Corporal Works of Mercy are **therefore "charitable actions by which we help our neighbors in their bodily needs."** They respond to the basic needs of humanity as we journey through this life. They are acts of love that address the physical and material needs of others. The Corporal Works of Mercy are based on Jesus' parable on the Judgment of the Nations in the Gospel of Matthew (Mt 25:31-46). There are seven corporal works of Mercy:

- * Feed the Hungry
- * Give Drink to the Thirsty
- * Shelter the Homeless
- * Visit the Sick
- * Visit Prisoners
- * Bury the Dead
- * Give Alms to the Poor

In the text from Matthew's Gospel cited above, Jesus cautions his disciples "whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Matthew 25:40). Whenever we help others, or carry out one of the corporal works of mercy, we are helping Jesus. Jesus wants us to favor the ones who most need our compassion and commitment, hence one of the Church's Seven Catholic Social Teaching principles – Fundamental Option for the Poor and Vulnerable. As disciples of Jesus, we are called to imitate Jesus' example. We are to show a special care for the poor and vulnerable members of society as Jesus did.

Consequently, to interpret scripture well, we need to ask what the human authors intended to communicate. We must consider the literary genres used and writing styles of their day when interpreting scripture. Just as Jesus is truly God and truly man, so scripture is truly God's word and truly the word of human beings.

Backman, Fredrik <u>A Man Called Ove</u>

In this novel, a New York Times bestseller, Ove may be the grumpiest man you have ever met. To him, rules are meant to be followed, signs are meant to be obeyed, modern technology is to be avoided. The recent movie, "A Man Called Otto" starring Tom Hanks, was based on Backman's novel. Ove has been this way his whole life, but since his wife died four years earlier, he has become even more inflexible. He has decided life without her is not worth living and is planning to commit suicide. But his plans are shaken up one day when a young family moves in next door; they announce their arrival by accidentally flattening his mailbox with their U-Haul. At this point many diverse people enter his life, all of them uninvited. This life-affirming book reminds us that life is to be treasured and people, with all their quirks, are to be welcomed. Confirmation Prep Registration

Registration for the Confirmation Preparation Program at St Paul's Church is now open. Confirmation preparation in the Diocese of Rochester is a two-year formation program that begins in 8th grade and is geared at helping the candidates in their faith development as well as helping them to understand the basic teachings of the Catholic Church. Any potential candidate can begin the program later than 8th grade.

The instructional content includes: an understanding of Confirmation as a Sacrament of Initiation with special connections to Baptism and First Eucharist; an understanding of the role of the Holy Spirit in the life of the individual and of the Church; a greater awareness of the person of Jesus Christ and his teachings as found in Scripture; an understanding of the importance of social justice; an understanding of the Catholic Church: its Divine origin, sacraments, doctrines, history and hierarchical structure; an understanding of the moral teachings of the Catholic Church including the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes; an understanding of the structure of the Mass and the manner for participating in it; an understanding of prayer and its importance in our lives; a working knowledge of the Catechism of the Catholic Church; an understanding of Christian vocations.

The fee is \$50 per candidate. Payments can be made in checks payable to St Paul Parish, memo: Confirmation or in cash at the parish office.
