Confirmation Prep Registration

Registration for the Confirmation Preparation Program at St Paul's Church is now open. Confirmation preparation in the Diocese of Rochester is a two-year formation program that begins in 8th grade and is geared at helping the candidates in their faith development as well as helping them to understand the basic teachings of the Catholic Church. Any potential candidate can begin the program later than 8th grade.

The instructional content includes: an understanding of Confirmation as a Sacrament of Initiation with special connections to Baptism and First Eucharist; an understanding of the role of the Holy Spirit in the life of the individual and of the Church; a greater awareness of the person of Jesus Christ and his teachings as found in Scripture; an understanding of the importance of social justice; an understanding of the Catholic Church: its Divine origin, sacraments, doctrines, history and hierarchical structure; an understanding of the moral teachings of the Catholic Church including the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes; an understanding of the structure of the Mass and the manner for participating in it; an understanding of prayer and its importance in our lives; a working knowledge of the Catechism of the Catholic Church; an understanding of Christian vocations.

To register, you may complete the form on the website: Confirmation/St. Paul's Roman Catholic Church (stpaulsrcc.org) or you may collect the Confirmation registration form on the Bulletin Board across from the parish office. The fee is \$50 per candidate. Payments can be made in checks payable to St Paul Parish, memo: Confirmation or in cash at the parish office. St. Paul's Question of the Week

Dear editor, what are the Spiritual Works of Mercy?

Dear reader, the Spiritual Works of Mercy have long been part of the Christian tradition, appearing in the works of theologians and spiritual writers throughout history. Just as Jesus attended to the spiritual well-being of those he ministered to, these Spiritual Works of Mercy guide us to "help our neighbor in their spiritual needs." There are seven Spiritual Works of Mercy:

- 1. **Counsel the Doubtful:** Everyone has moments of doubt in their faith journey. Nevertheless, we should always remember that Christ is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. We should always turn to Christ. If a friend should ask you for advice, you should orient your response to Christ.
- 2. **Instruct the Ignorant:** Learn about our Catholic faith and be open to talking with others about our beliefs. There is always something more to discover about our faith.
- 3. Admonishing the Sinner: Be supportive in helping others find their way and correct their mistakes. We must strive to create a culture that does not accept sin as the norm, while realizing that we all fall at times. We are all in need of God's loving correction.
- 4. Comforting the Sorrowful: Be open to listening and comforting those who are dealing with grief. Even if we are not sure of the right words to say, our presence can make a big difference. Lend a listening ear to those going through a tough time.
- 5. **Forgiving Injuries:** Jesus teaches us that we should forgive as God forgives, relying on him to help us show others the mercy of God.
- 6. **Bearing Wrongs Patiently:** Do not be bitter about wrongs done against you. If you are frustrated withs someone, pray for the person.
- 7. **Praying for the Living and the Dead:** Prayer is one of the most powerful ways we can support others. Joining together in prayer for the living and the dead entrusts us all into God's care. You can request a Mass intention for a friend or family member who is going through a tough time, or for one who has passed away. Ask a family member or a friend if there is anything you can pray for them about.

(Raising Teens with Love and Understanding)

The authors have extensive experience as counselors, high school teachers, and parents. All parents want what is best for their kids, but parents are sometimes unsure about what is best for their teenagers, and the teenagers usually have strong ideas of their own about what is best for them. Parents should not expect a problem-free relationship, but a relationship rooted in trust, honesty, love, and mutual respect. Understanding the developmental stages of adolescence is essential; knowing what to expect is very helpful to parents who wish to truly communicate with their teenager. The authors use many stories from their own lives to illustrate the ten gifts mentioned in the title; these gifts range from "respect" to "responsibility" to "role model". With candor and humor, they explain what they have learned from each of those stories and offer specific steps parents can take to achieve their parenting goals.
