





September 7, 2022, will mark my one year anniversary of working at St. Paul's Church. This year has been one of great joy. I truly love working here and having the opportunity to meet so many wonderful, beautiful souls. You have made me a better Christian by your example, devotion, dedication, and dynamic love for Christ. Thank you.

One reality I've experienced here at St. Paul's is, this is a parish built on love, friendship, caring, and compassion for one another. This isn't just a place where people come to worship. It is a dwelling that people come to be with their friends, to share their dreams and worries. It is where you come to laugh, to cry, to listen, to find God, and to raise your families. This is a place of comfort. It is home.

We are all called to come to Christ's table. To be part of His family, and the Eucharistic Revival is a reminder of this call. Look around St. Paul's. Is someone you care for missing from weekly celebrations? Reach out to them. Let them know how much their parish family misses them. Welcome them back home with loving arms.

As we begin the two-year Eucharistic Revival, we are called to look at the importance of the Eucharist within our Parish community. Communion not only means Eucharist; it also means "our fellowship and union with Jesus and other baptized Christians in the Church, which as its source and summit is the celebration of the Eucharist" as defined by the Catholic Catechism. It is the Eucharist that unites us to Christ and to one another, building this beautiful community.

Throughout history Christ has revealed Himself to His faithful through the Eucharist. In rare instances, He has revealed Himself through Eucharistic Miracles. One of the most famous Eucharistic Miracle occurred in Lanciano, Italy when the Body and Blood of Christ turned into actual flesh and blood. A Basilian Monk was having doubts about the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. As he finished saying the words of consecration, the host, which was still in his hands, and the wine which sat before him, turned into the actual flesh and blood of Christ. Many scientific studies have been performed on this Eucharist to confirm its authenticity. A 1971 study found that the flesh was that of the heart from a man with AB blood type who was living and under extreme distress and suffering. This miracle was not meant to be hidden, but to be shared for the world, just as Christ came to save the world. (The photos below are of the miracle which is on display at Church of San Francesco in Lanciano, Italy.)

Christ calls each of us into communion with Him and His Church. It is the Eucharist that sets our Church apart. Christ is present in the Eucharist, and He is present in each of you. Continue to let Him shine in, and through you.

Here Comes Everybody! (Stories of Church)

When the Irish writer James Joyce was asked to describe the Catholic Church, he answered, "Here comes everybody." Indeed, the church is a melting pot of ethnicities and cultures. It is filled with saints and sinners because it is filled with people. Tim Unsworth, who was a longtime columnist for *National Catholic Reporter*, tells many of their stories in this book. Some of the stories are funny: others are serious. This is a Church that buried so many members of the Mafia that the author wondered if the local seminary taught how to anoint a guy in the trunk of a car. It is a Church that once forgot to bury one of its bishops until he was finally discovered in the basement 44 years later.
