



Geeds for the Journey

Seek the Treasures of Heaven

It is very important for the Christian to develop a personal and deep relationship with God. We cannot be friends with God, while at the same time maintaining friendship with the world. The Christian cannot serve both God and wealth. This is also a core teaching found in Matthew 6:24: "No one can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and mammon." While Christians need the necessary financial resources to live a comfortable live and to provide for their families, Christians should be vigilant that they are not led astray by the attractiveness of riches to the detriment of their relationship with God.

In today's Gospel reading from Luke, someone in the crowd said to Jesus: "Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me" (Luke 12:13). It was not uncommon for the Jews to take their unsettled disputes to respected Rabbis; but Jesus refused to involve himself with individual disputes about money. Jesus however, uses the opportunity to teach his followers, which includes us, about our attitude to material things in the <u>Parable of the Rich Fool</u>. The rich man, after he had stored up a lot for himself, said to himself: "rest, eat, drink and be merry!" According to the bible scholar William Barclay, two things stand out about this man: 1) he never saw beyond himself and 2) he never saw beyond this world. The rich man had much wealth; however, his attitude was antithetical to Christianity. Instead of finding happiness in giving, he sought happiness by trying to conserve his wealth. His plans were all made on the basis of this earthly life. He failed to acknowledge that he is not the author of life.

The author of the book of Ecclesiastes cautions us in today's First Reading about the futility of wealth: "vanity of vanities, says Qoheleth, vanity of vanities! All things are vanity!" The wise man Qoheleth warns that it is passing away; these things in life are only temporal. This is contrasted with God's permanence. We can say, using philosophical terms that we are in a state of becoming; while the God, the Supreme being is the unmoved mover, borrowing the language of the Greek ancient philosopher, Aristotle. Catholic theology teaches that the those here on earth belong to the pilgrim Church. Christians are on a pilgrimage to their heavenly home, the eternal Jerusalem.

Today's Liturgy cautions us against seeking independence from God. Jesus wants us to seek first the kingdom of God. Let us work for the things that last forever. It is not sinful to be wealthy. The problem is the attitude towards riches and wealth. Do we share with those in need? Do we put our trust in riches and wealth rather than trusting in God? Do we prioritize material possessions over our Christian obligations like the command to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of obligation? Let us reflect on this admonition: "If we seek the treasures of Heaven, our hearts will be fixed on Heaven; but if we seek the treasures of earth, our hearts will be bound to earth, and some day we must say good-bye to them."

St. Paul's Question of the Week

Question: Dear Editor, if God is Good and all-powerful, why does He allow so much suffering and evil in the world?

Response: Suffering is a difficult and inevitable part of life. It can cause us to collapse into fear, rage, or despair. The psalmist wrote: ..."my only friend is darkness" (Psalm 88). Unfortunately, sentiments like this do not make good sympathy cards.

When tragedy strikes, many respond by saying that God must have a good reason, that everything is within God's providence, or that He is allowing suffering to make us stronger, While all these things are true, the worlds can ring hollow for those overwhelmed by grief or loss. Suffering can indeed lead to unforeseen goods or contribute to character growth. The story of Job contains profound insight into the nature of suffering. After chapters of questioning God, Job is reduced to silence. God does not attempt to answer all of Job's questions one by one, but simply makes it clear that He is God, and John is not (see Job 38:1-42:6). In the end, the only answer Job gets to the problem of pain is the person of God. This answer becomes ever clearer on Good Friday.

Look at the crucifix. Take a moment to pause, look and reflect. The crucifix is a brutal display. The cross is the greatest sign of love in history. It reveals that God would die not only to redeem us, but to be with us in our experiences of darkness. Through the cross and resurrection God presents us, not with a theoretical answer to the problem of evil, but with God's own transforming life. We have the promise and hope of the empty tomb on Easter Sunday. We suffer, but we suffer in hope, trusting that we have a God who never abandons us, who is with us always.





