Jesus wants to work through us to accomplish His mission. He gives us the joy and strength to respond generously to His invitation, "Come to me..." (Mt. 11:28-29) and his commission, "Go therefore, and make disciples of all nations..." (Mt. 28:19-20). The more we encounter Jesus in prayer, in the Word of God, in Mass, in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, the more we hear the urgent call to proclaim His Gospel.

Pope Benedict said, "The Church exists to evangelize by sharing the Gospel with people who have never heard of Christ, strengthen the faith of those already Baptized and reaching out to those who have drifted away from the Church." The care of proclaiming the Gospel in every corner of the world belongs to all baptized Christians. Hence promoting missionary spirit among all Catholics is the purpose for Pontifical Mission Societies and Diocesan Office for the Propagation of the Faith. There are four Pontifical Mission Societies:

- 1. The Society for the Propagation of the Faith: Provides financial support to mission bishops for pastoral and evangelizing programs, catechetical work, the building of churches, health care facilities, schools etc.
- 2. The Society of St. Peter the Apostle: Provides money to educate seminarians.
- 3. The Holy Childhood Association: Provides money for a variety of assistance including education, medical and nutrition programs for children.
- 4. The Missionary Union of Priests and Religious: Provides resources to increase awareness of the Church Missionary role among priests and religious, to inspire them to become missionaries.

In addition to the Pontifical Missions, each diocese has an office to coordinate, promote and support missionary work. Throughout the Universal Church, the next to last Sunday every October is designated as World Mission Sunday. The intent is educating and uniting Catholics in prayer and in the collection of money needed to fund the missions. We celebrate Diocesan Missions Sunday on the third Sunday in May to raise money for funding of our own Sisters of St. Joseph in Brazil and Sisters of Mercy in Chile. We also have a Missions Co-operative Plan – each summer we invite missionaries to visit our Diocese to make an appeal at each of our parishes on their behalf.

Thank you for your continued prayers and financial support to missionaries and missions. Don't forget to say a prayer for me and Jodie for the success of our work at the Diocesan Office for the Propagation of the Faith.



Wolff, Catherine, ed. Not Less Than Everything

Many Catholics today are struggling with the conflict between tradition, modern culture and scientific discovery. Joan of Arc, Ignatius of Loyola, Caravaggio, Dorothy Day, and Oscar Romero are among the many people whose stories are told in this book. They all had one thing in common: they were Catholics whose beliefs caused them to be persecuted. They spoke or acted in ways that challenged the prevailing authorities, knowing they risked reputation, livelihood, sometimes even their heads-all while remaining faithful. Today, they are revered by the church. We can learn from them about what It means to be a member of a community even while in tension with that community.
