Formerly a professor of history of religions at Fordham University, Berry became aware of a variety of environmental problems earlier than most--from pollution to unbridled consumption to biodiversity loss. He wondered why religions have been blind to the fate of the earth; the universe is the supreme manifestation of the sacred.
