

Seeds for the Journey


"Rejoice in the Lord Always!"

Jukes, Andrew Four Views of Christ

Dr. Jukes freely acknowledges that the four Gospels differ from one another in many aspects. He argues that each author had a distinct and specific purpose in view in writing his account. **Matthew** had been an official of the Roman Empire; he had been accustomed to contemplating a vast kingdom. Thus he represents Jesus in connection with a certain kingdom: as the Seed of Abraham and an heir of an elect Kingdom. **Mark** was the Apostle's servant. In Mark's Gospel, Christ stands as the Patient Servant who sacrifice for others. **Luke** sees Jesus as the Son of Adam or the Son of Man, not so much connected with a kingdom, as the One whose sympathies linked Him with Adam's fallen and ruined children. **John**, who leaned on the bosom of his Lord, sees Him as the Son in the bosom in the Father, as One "not of this world."
