

Seeds for the Journey



"Do not be afraid." Those are the words of consolation and hope that the angel of God offered to Joseph in a dream as he contemplated how to proceed after discovering that Mary, his betrothed, was with child. "Do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home," the angel said. That was certainly not an easy command for Joseph to follow because Joseph had plenty to fear. Mary was with child and Joseph knew it wasn't his. He had a choice to expose her and leave her fate to the Jewish officials while disgracing both of their families, quietly divorce her according to Jewish law at the time, or take her as his wife. It must have been an agonizing thought process. But the angel's revelation to Joseph that Mary's child was indeed a result of the action of God, not of a man, con-

vinced Joseph that the just choice was for him to take Mary into his home despite any public humiliation that might occur.

So Joseph, out of obedience to God and a deep love for Mary, received Mary as his wife, taking full responsibility for her and the child in her womb, the child who would soon be called Emmanuel, God is with us. Joseph, of course, knew that his life and that of Mary's was forever changed. But he had no idea what the future would bring. He was still in awe of the task God had given to him. In the silence of his heart he was likely wondering why God choose him to be the father of His Son, wondering what it all meant. But being the righteous man that he was Joseph took to God in prayer whatever life brought him, forever leaning on the words of hope spoken to him by an angel, "Do not be afraid;" words that inspired confidence that God was always with him.

Do you ever find yourself afraid to step out in faith or hesitant to do what you know is the right thing to do or say for fear of the consequences? If so consider yourself one among many. Living in a world antagonistic to the Christian faith is certainly a challenge. But the story of Mary and Joseph, a very human story of love, agonizing choices, and faith, inspires us to believe - to trust, that God is always with us, encouraging us to do what is right and just.

The words of hope spoken to Joseph by the angel, "Do not be afraid," are meant for us as well. Do not be afraid to live your faith, to speak the truth, to advocate for justice. Do not be afraid to love your neighbor, to feed the hungry, to cloth the naked, to shelter the homeless. Do not be afraid to respect the sacred dignity of every man, woman, and child - the unborn and the dying.

Do not be afraid, for Emmanuel, God, is with us!


McDonnell, S.S.N.D., Rea Into the Heart of Mary

Remember to stop by the John Walsh Library when you come to Mass. There are many resources available for Advent and Christmas for both adults and children. Check it out!




Ministry Schedule for December 24 & 25, 2022


