The green of Ordinary time is replaced with the color of purple for the Advent season. Now stands a Christmas tree near the stained glass windows, waiting to be decorated with ornaments representing our faith family. A solid wooden Mary and Joseph with an empty manger is set in front of the altar, waiting for the arrival of baby Jesus on Christmas Eve. Beautiful purple banners hang on the walls, st pedestals, and from the ceiling in the Worship Space continuing into the Narthex and hallway where st there are Nativity scenes placed on the benches to keep us focused. *



******* A large green Advent wreath with 5 candles: 3 purple, 1 pink and 1 white is placed near the altar. * The **<u>CIRCLE</u>** of the wreath signifies continuous life with no beginning or end symbolizing the everlasting * life we find in Christ.

* Each mass a family will be processing with Fr. Paul, Deacon Mark and altar servers following the cross. * After bowing, they will light the color candle(s) for that Advent week. **

- Week 1 Purple: (Hope) "The Prophecy Candle" represents the expectation felt in anticipation of the coming of Jesus.
- Week 2 Purple: (Faith) "The Bethlehem Candle" is a reminder of Mary & Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.
- **** • Week 3 Pink: (Joy) "The Shepherd's Candle" reminds us of the joy the world experiences at the birth of Jesus. *
 - Week 4 Purple: (Peace) "The Angel's Candle" reminds us of the message of "Peace on Earth, good will towards Men".
 - Christmas Eve White: (Purity) "The Christ Candle" represents Jesus' purity.

On Saturday, December 19th the St. Paul's Confirmation candidates visited Bethany House. Bethany house is a home open to homeless women and children who have dealt with past traumas or hardships in their lives. We visited this house to help the families living there by cleaning and doing chores around the house. However, more importantly we furthered our understanding of the importance of helping others, and are extremely grateful to have been given the opportunity to help the women and children.

We started the day with an opening prayer, and watched a video about a woman named Dorothy Day, who is in the process of becoming a saint. Dorothy made many contributions to the world and to our religious community. During a war period, she described noticing all of the people around her struggling and wanted to make a change. Therefore, she founded the Catholic Worker Movement that has impacted many lives today. The Bethany House was influenced by Dorothy Day's contributions, focusing on helping those in need. We were taught by the video that it is extremely important to make our best efforts to help others, as we never know the challenges they have faced throughout their life.

We then began chores around the home, and while doing so, got to interact with the women and children living there. We painted rooms, cleaned the children's toys, organized the kitchen, sorted through piles of donations, etc. We were delighted to have been able to help, as the women at the Bethany House were able to relax and have a day off from their daily household obligations. Not only was it a positive way to support our community, but it also helped us bond in our confirmation group and with the families living there. We all would love to help around the house again, and truly enjoyed the experience.

In conclusion, we learned that helping and supporting those less fortunate is one of the most important contributions a Catholic can make. As we continue our journey to Confirmation, we will learn more about how lending a helping hand to others will strengthen our bond with God. Boyle, S.J., Gregory Tattoos on the Heart

Father Boyle received the Laetare Medal from Notre Dame University in recognition of his outstanding service to the Catholic Church and to society. In his address at Notre Dame, Father Boyle stressed that we should not simply do things FOR other people, we should do things WITH other people. Better known as "G-Dog" to his "homeboys," he became the pastor of Dolores Mission Church, the poorest parish in Los Angeles, in 1986. In 1988 he buried his first young person killed because of gang violence, a task he would perform an additional 167 times over the next twenty years. He founded Homeboy Industries, the largest gang intervention, rehabilitation, and re-entry program in the United States. In this book he introduces us to some unforgettable people, from a twelve-year-old boy who justified dating a sixteen-year-old girl "because she's short," to a boy he baptized at Juvenile Hall only to inform him after the ceremony that his brother had been killed by a rival gang member. Like Christ, Father Boyle meets people where they are and sees the beauty and worth of every person. He tells their stories with humor, compassion, and heartbreak. (Call No. 277.94-BOY)
