





Catholics from age 18-59 are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Fridays during Lent. Have one full meal and two smaller meals, with no snacking between meals. Abstinence means Catholics of age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays during Lent.

The generosity of the good people of God allows the Commission to give helpful grants to dioceses across the country to operate schools, parishes, and


other missionary services that build the Body of Christ in Catholic communities.

Dear editor, what are the expectations as we begin the Season of Lent?

Dear reader, as you are probably aware, Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday this year falls on February 14, which is also Valentine's Day. Of course, the Christian celebration of Ash Wednesday takes priority over Valentine's Day. Lent is a 40-day season of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. It ends just before the Mass of the Last Supper on Holy Thursday. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading scripture, we serve by giving alms and we practice self-control through fasting. We are not only called to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully.

Every Friday we commemorate the crucifixion of Jesus which is why it is established as a penitential day throughout the whole year. The season of Lent, especially Fridays of Lent, are intense moments of the Church's penitential practice. Catholics are strongly encouraged to carry out spiritual exercises such as the Stations of the Cross, pilgrimages as signs of penance, voluntary self-denial such as fasting and almsgiving, and fraternal sharing (charitable and missionary works).

There are two very important forms of penance: fasting and abstinence. **Catholics are obliged to abstain from eating meat; however, they may eat fish.** Fasting means that the faithful are only allowed to eat one full meal during the day. On fast days, the eating of solid foods between meals is prohibited. **Catholics are expected to observe abstinence and fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.** They are also encouraged to fast on Holy Saturday. Generally, Abstinence and fasting should be observed on all Fridays, unless that Friday is a Solemnity.

The law of abstinence binds those who have sufficient use of reason and those who have completed their fourteenth (14th) year of age, that is, after midnight on the day they celebrate their fourteenth birthday. The law of abstinence binds one's whole life.

The law of fasting binds those who have attained their maturity, that is, after midnight on the day they celebrate their eighteenth birthday. It continues to bind until the beginning of their sixtieth year, that is, until midnight of their fifty-ninth birthday. Summarily, those between 18 and 60 years old are expected to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

The Church requires that since penance belongs to the Christian life, children, although they are not strictly bound by the law of fasting and abstinence, should be educated in a genuine sense of penance and should even perform acts of penance appropriate to their age and understanding.

The US bishops have maintained Ash Wednesday and Good Friday as obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics, and Fridays during Lent as obligatory days of abstinence. According to the US bishops, when fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Fasting from Good Friday and if possible, extending to the Easter Vigil as the "paschal fast" is to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection.

When reading a passage from scripture, readers are encouraged to place themselves within the scene and notice what is around them, who else is there, and what they see and hear. 
