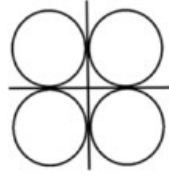

The beautiful weather has arrived. The flowers are blooming and the grass is green and plush. However, the weeds are also in full growth.

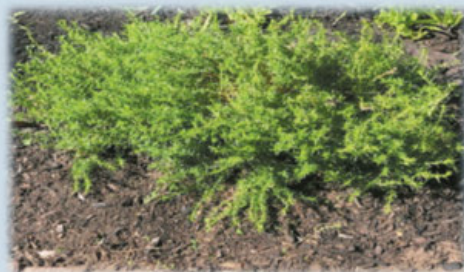
Some weeds:

Prayers and relying on the Father, the Son, the Holy Spirit to assist us with the removal of our "weeds" is our best "Roundup".



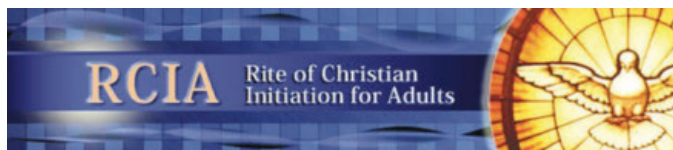

"Christ Present in the Word"

"It is truly Christ who speaks when the holy scriptures are read in the Church," teaches the Church. Since Vatican II, it is normal for a Liturgy of the Word to accompany the celebrations of sacraments. The Church has also strengthened the relationship of Word and Eucharist (made visible in the placing of the Book of the Gospels upon the altar), developing a 3-year cycle of readings to be used for Sunday Mass. The Introduction to the Lectionary for Mass sums it up in this way: "In the hearing of God's word the Church is built up and grows...past works in the history of salvation are presented anew as mysterious realities."

Saint of the Summer *St. Kateri Tekakwitha*

Born: 1656
Died: April 17, 1680
Feast Day: July 14



Kateri Tekakwitha was born near the present-day town of Auriesville, NY. Her mother, an Algonquin, was a Christian. Her father, a leader among his people, the Mohawk, was not. When a smallpox epidemic struck her village, her family took ill and died. Kateri was adopted by her uncle, a Mohawk chief. Although he disapproved, he granted Kateri's request to receive religious instruction from a Jesuit missionary.

After her baptism, Kateri was shunned by her village and she decided to travel to a Catholic mission near Montreal, in Canada. At the mission Kateri taught prayers to children and told them stories about the life of Jesus. She nursed the sick, gathered offerings for those in need, and helped the elderly with their daily chores.

When her life became hard, Kateri turned to God in prayer. She focused on helping others, sharing stories about Jesus, and doing everyday chores as acts of love.

The Gift of Peace (Personal Reflections)

In the final two months of his life, Cardinal Bernardin, head of the archdiocese of Chicago, made it his mission to share his personal insights. He used the previous three years as a framework; a time period which included a false accusation of sexual misconduct, a diagnosis of cancer, its return after a remission of fifteen months. Yet, at the end of his life he was at peace. He had reconciled with his accuser and had remained a priest first and a patient second throughout his cancer journey. He observed that when we are at peace, we let go of what is nonessential. He died just 13 days after he completed this book (his "letter" to us). In his conclusion, he acknowledged the harshness of Chicago winters and the comfort of knowing that spring would come. He knew he would not be alive that spring but would experience a new life in a different way. (Call No. 92-BER)
