

Seeds for the Journey

The History of the Chicken BBQ Fundraiser

As we have just completed our seventh BBQ, here's a little history of the event.

Back in 2014 while investigating possible fundraisers we decided to try a Chicken BBQ. Other local churches did them and it seemed to be a fun way to raise money. (Little did we know.)

Our first was in 2015. We hired a caterer from Buffalo who cooked on a charcoal grill in the grass. It was on a Saturday to get the after-Mass crowd. Many lessons were learned that year, such as don't have the servers and food in the parking lot (or folks will drive around the barriers and right up to them). Also while Saturday was good for getting sales, it was a bit distracting for Mass (which is the real reason we are here).

The second year we changed caterers to Ace Automatics who use a charcoal rotisserie for more even results. We also changed locations and travelled to the Village to pair the BBQ with Webster's "Free Friday Night Concert at the Gazebo." It was a great idea, only to be stifled by rain, the rotisserie breaking down, a competing BBQ, and a misunderstanding about the advertising.

Next year: 2017 and back at church. We chose our date, the Friday of Father's Day weekend, which we have been using ever since. It's the weekend of an annual large local soccer tournament (think hungry families) and no competing BBQs. We added the option of inside seating to promote the BBQ as a social event as well as a fundraiser: a "funraiser!" Lesson learned: we need a <u>lot</u> of volunteers to do inside as well as outside sales.

Over the next two years the BBQ Committee fine-tuned the event. Still no sell-outs but more folks were coming inside so that was a positive. We sold water, soda, and ice cream sandwiches inside as well. Nobody bought the ice cream, so the volunteers got an extra bonus! We were looking forward to continuing this event and then the pandemic hit. So 2020 had no BBQ.


We came back last year as a drive thru only. We moved the rotisserie to the back and the servers to the garage. As much as we missed seeing the inside diners, it was much easier. Last year was noteworthy due to the person who paid for the person behind them, and then this act of kindness kept repeating for a good while.

► This year continued with drive thru only in the same manner. There were requests to have an outside
 ► space for eating, but with the traffic in the parking lot we had safety concerns about setting this up.
 ► This year's customers were very generous, and many said "keep the change" – even when buying a \$12
 ► dinner with a \$20 bill.

And...this year we sold out! Hooray! (Thanks to the parishioner who bought the last 9 dinners at 6:00PM.) Many thanks to all who volunteer; it <u>is</u> fun but also a lot of work. Thanks also to everyone who comes and buys a dinner to support us.

We'll see you next year for our 8th Annual Chicken BBQ "Funraiser!"

Doyle, Brian A Book of Uncommon Prayer (100 Celebrations of the Miracle & Muddle of the Ordinary)


