Jesus first used these words after his resurrection, appearing to His disciples who were in hiding, saying, "Peace be with you." This was not a simple greeting but a declaration of His presence, a prayer for their peace, and a source of strength for them.



"Peace be with you" embodies a sense of wholeness, tranquility, and well-being as a prayer, a wish, and a reminder of Christ's gift of peace to His followers.

Fr. Paul says: "The peace of the Lord be with you always!" During the Mass, and the congregation responds, "And with your spirit".

Deacon Mark invites us to share the "Sign of Peace," with one another before receiving Communion symbolizing unity and harmony within the community. Offering the sign of peace to one another reflects God's love and mercy.

Everyday Stewardship Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments

If you had \$100 to give away, to whom would you give it? Perhaps you would choose someone you love. How about someone on the street at a corner stoplight? You could really make someone's day if you gave it to them as a tip after a modestly priced meal. There are so many possibilities. No matter to whom you give the \$100, you are certainly being generous. No one can debate that.

Let's say you have narrowed it down to two different people. You know both of these people, and you suspect each person would be equally grateful. Does it make a difference who you give the money to in the end? What if I told you that one of the individuals just got a big raise at work, and the other person is at risk of having their water turned off because they have been late paying their bill. Does it make a difference now?

Discernment should always be an important part of any good steward's way of life. If we give simply for the sake of giving, that may not always be the best use of our gifts. In order to gain the most fruit from the seeds we plant, we must plant wisely. All we have been given has value, and we need be good caretakers of it all. If you ever do find yourself with \$100 to spare, be sure to carefully consider all the options and make the wiser choice. In the meantime, pray for wisdom and reflect on how to best use all you have been given for the sake of the Kingdom of God.



Phalen, C.S.C., John Living the Rosary

When he was a small boy, Father Phalen used to mischievously disrupt family rosary time with tricks and jokes, but eventually he grew to appreciate its beauty. He uses scripture, the lives of the Saints, and his own past pastoral experiences to lead readers into a deeper appreciation of the personal impact of the mysteries of the rosary. He reminds us that God's incarnation continues today and that we can participate in this miracle through this powerful meditative prayer, the rosary. Beginning with his own vocation story (an example of "annunciation"), he offers 20 different stories that will help readers understand and live each mystery of the rosary.
