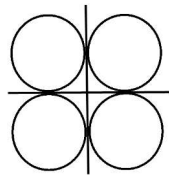

From the beginning of his Papacy Pope Leo XIV has been drawing attention to Catholic Social Teaching (CST), referring to CST as a treasure of teachings concerning the poor which guides the Church as it works to address changing times and the dignity of those living on the margins of society. The Pope's recent Encyclical, *Magnifica Humanitas*, which addresses the inviolability of human dignity in the light of technological advancements, specifically in relation to artificial intelligence, is firmly grounded in CST. I have no doubt that we will be hearing much more about CST from Pope Leo XIV moving forward. To that end, you will find a summary of the seven primary principles of CST below.

1. Life and Dignity of the Human Person: This principle of CST proclaims that all human life is sacred; that every human being is created in the image and likeness of God and is therefore worthy of our greatest respect. In other words, we believe that every human life is precious and far more important than material things. The way we measure an institution or a society is by the way it threatens or enhances the life and dignity of every person. This principle is the basis of all of CST.

2. Call to the Family, Community, and Participation: This principle teaches us that every person is not only sacred but is also social, and that the human person grows and becomes their best selves within community. The primary community that must be supported and strengthened is the family. That is why it is so important for us to be aware of what is happening in our communities, and to be involved in politics, neighborhood events, community organizations, etc., especially where these things address the needs of the poor and vulnerable. As children of the family of God, we must work for social conditions that ensure that every person is able to meet their basic needs and realize their full potential.

3. Rights and Responsibilities: This principle teaches us that human dignity (your dignity) can be protected, and a healthy community can be achieved only if human rights are protected and only if everyone lives up to their responsibilities for each other, in our families and our communities. To put it simply, every person has a fundamental right to life and a right to those things required for human decency.

4. Option for the Poor and Vulnerable: This principle teaches that the needs of the poor must come first in any given society, and that a basic test of any community is how the poor and vulnerable people are doing. In other words, the extent of the suffering of the poor is a measure of how well a community, such as Webster or St Paul's, is living the Gospel message to love our neighbor. This principle also teaches us that every public policy, i.e., the laws, rules, and regulations that govern us, must be evaluated according to how they affect the poorest and most vulnerable people in our society.

5. Dignity of Work and Rights of Workers: This principle teaches us that the economy serves people, not the other way around. Work is not just what we do to make money and earn a living; it is a *participation* in God's plan for creation. Work is a basic human right that promotes the dignity of men and women who are made in the image of God. By respecting the right of everyone to work we enhance the economy and the well-being of everyone in the community. Work then, is not just a right, it is a duty that enhances all of society.

6. Solidarity: This principle teaches us that we are one human family, no matter what our national, racial, ethnic, economic, and political differences might be. We are called to love our neighbors whether they live next door to us or on the other side of the world. Saint JP II defined solidarity as: "*a firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to the common good; that is to say to the good of all and of each individual, because we are all really responsible for all.*" (Sollicitudo Rei Socialis, no. 38).

7. Care for God's Creation: This principle teaches us that love and respect for God involves respecting and caring for all that God has created. In other words, not only are we called to love and respect our neighbor, but we are also called to care for the earth as well. By respecting the earth and its environment we are promoting the dignity of human life and creating the means for everyone to achieve their highest potential.

As Christians, Jesus calls us to love God and love our neighbor. CST provides us with the background and awareness needed to live our faith within the communities God has placed us in; to be the loving people God has called us to be, and to respect the sacred dignity of every human being. It challenges us to change the way we behave in society and to find ways to get involved, to become a part of something that promotes the good of society, especially that of the poor.

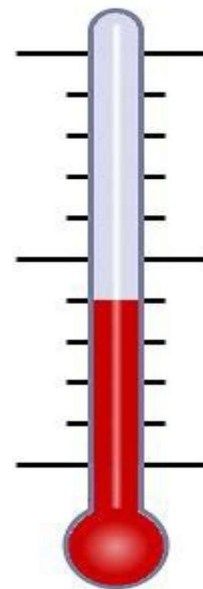
**Look What's New in the

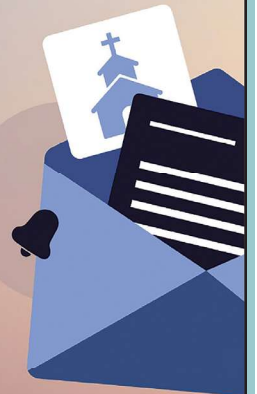
