





Catholic Relief Services Campaign on Climate Change

Did you know that the earth's climate has varied naturally since the beginning of time? However, scientific research has shown that natural influences, including volcanic activity and solar radiation, have been fairly stable over the past ninety years, while the earth's temperature has increased to levels not seen in hundreds of years, especially over the past three decades. Scientists theorize that this increase in temperature is directly related to increasing levels of greenhouse gases, in particular CO2, which has increased almost 40% over the past 150 years.

While we can debate the cause of climate change, what we can't deny is the fact that climate change, whether natural or manmade, is impacting the lives of millions of people around the world in a variety of ways. Some of the major impacts of climate change include a growing number and severity of storms, rising sea levels, an increase in ocean acidity, changing seasonal weather patterns, the loss of fresh water resources coupled with soil erosion, and an increase in health risks from allergens as well as water, air, and insect borne diseases.

As one might expect, the human cost of these climate change impacts is that of diminished livelihoods from the loss of income, health issues, increased food insecurity, as well as hunger and malnutrition, all of which can induce conflict, ultimately leading to migration, i.e., desperate people leaving their homes in search of security and a better life! Of course the people who are the least prepared and least capable of dealing with climate change are the poorest and most vulnerable among us, most of whom depend on agriculture for their livelihoods. These are people living in areas where Catholic Relief Services is most heavily involved.

This month CRS is embarking on a new campaign called "*Lead the Way on Climate Change*." The goal of the campaign is to improve the livelihoods of those most affected by climate change either through mitigation, which involves efforts to eliminate the sources of climate change using deforestation and carbon retention programs, or by employing adaptation programs involving better water and soil management, improved crop production, and pest and disease control.

Where the brightness of the stars and the moon could be seen, now the night sky lights up with car headlights.

Send your Holy Spirit to water our arid hearts with hope, stoke in us the flame of fraternity, make us set the world on fire with acts of justice in favor of those who suffer most, transform our attitudes and make our minds fertile to new ways of living.

Enlighten us to propose, support and defend projects and laws that protect the environment, take our hands to till ways of solidarity, and make our works and words bear fruit.

Send your Holy Spirit like a wind that changes the way we relate to each other and to nature, like a fresh breeze that purifies our intentions, like fire that ignites our being with your love for our common home and those who live in it.

Make us overflow with joy once again when we contemplate your wonders.

Keating, Thomas The Kingdom of God Is Like...

Some of the most vivid messages in the Gospels are found in the parables and sayings of Jesus. In this book Father Keating reflects on many of these parables, from the Parable of the Good Samaritan to the Parable of the Unjust Judge. He often responds to the parable story with another story from our own time. When rightly understood, the parables help us see how wise a teacher Jesus was. How revolutionary, in the best sense of that word, was the content of what he taught and to which he bore witness by his life and by his death. Sometimes their very familiarity causes the modern reader to miss the insights these stories offer into the most profound issues of life. Although originally told to people living in a vastly different world from today, these stories are timeless and have much to say to today's readers. (Call No. 226.8-KEA)
