Well, one, because I drew a blank when trying to come up with a subject, but mainly because I've come to realize that I've started to take a bit of a spiritual vacation. Chittister, Joan Happiness

Everyone wants to be happy. But happiness is not a random accident of existence; it is a positive state that we can acquire. Society, culture, and advertising all play a part in defining happiness. It is so easy to concentrate on what we do not have and lose consciousness of what we do have. In this book, Joan Chittister explores what she calls an "archeology of happiness," digging through the archives of life's major fields of study—sociology, biology, neurology, psychology, philosophy, and religion—to determine how happiness has been defined throughout the ages. She hopes her readers will reflect on all these ideas and form a kind of philosophy of happiness for themselves. They can then root out whatever is seeking to undermine their moments of happiness and learn to keep their focus on happiness rather than simply on pleasure. (Call No. 152.4-CHI)
