





Seeds for the Journey



This weekend we celebrate the Feast of two great Apostles who had different personalities and backgrounds. However, they both believed and proclaimed the Good News of Jesus Christ. Peter kept preaching about Christ despite threats from authorities and even imprisonment in a heavily guarded jail. His miraculous deliverance from the prison guards at night only helped confirm his conviction about Jesus' power and authority to save. Of course, Peter in his discipleship journey had ups and downs. He got rebuked by Jesus for suggesting that suffering and death did not need to be part of the Messiah's mission (Mt 16:21-23). In Mt 26:69-75, Peter denied any association with Jesus whom he had already declared the Messiah, anointed one of the living God.

Peter sometimes was a man of strong faith like the time he said "Lord, whom shall we go?" You have the words of eternal life (John 6:68). Some other times he lacked faith like in Mt 14:30 when he cried, "Lord save me" after he began to sink while walking on water towards Jesus. Jesus knew Peter's weaknesses and yet He called him to become a Fisher of Men and named as the "rock" on which Jesus was to build the Church.

The Second Reading today tells us about our Patron Saint Paul who writes a letter to his friend Timothy from his prison in Rome. He shares how he was rescued by the Lord "from the lions mouth." Maybe he was thinking of his past life as a persecutor of Christians, or his suffering in 2 Corinthians 12:8 when he asked the Lord three times to take it away, or maybe he was imagining the pain of death which his current confirmment in a prison could lead. He is aware that his blood is about to be poured out like a libation. His death is imminent. As he looked back on his life, he is satisfied that after conversion he spent his energy spreading the Gospel. He preached the Good News and wrote many letters about Jesus Christ and the Church. He was confident that he had "finished the race and kept the faith." He looked forward to receiving the crown of righteousness.

St. Peter and St. Paul have shown us how to endure sacrifices and struggles as we proclaim the Good News with courage, dedication and love.

As missionary disciples, we can't all go to the mission territories, but we can help the missionaries like Fr. Lukong from Benedict Institute of Africa with prayers and financial support.

Second Collection: Aid to the Church in Central & Eastern Europe



Riccardi Andrea The Saint Egidio Book of Prayer

In 1968, Andrea Riccardi gathered together a small group of fellow high school students in response to the Second Vatical Council's universal call to holiness. They used their talents to tutor without charge children living in impoverished areas of Rome. Their numbers quickly grew, and in 1973 they were given the use of an old Carmelite church, the Church of Saint Egidio. Today this community has over 60,000 members in more than 70 different countries. At the end of each day, every one of these communities gathers to pray, to listen to the word of the Lord. This book is a collection of these formal prayers, readings, and meditations. (Call No. 242-RAC)
