



Next weekend, March 9 & 10, our parish will join with Catholic parishes across the Diocese and country to take up the annual Catholic Relief Services collection.

This special national collection helps support the U.S. Catholic community's global social ministry carried out in our name by six U.S. Catholic agencies, including Catholic Relief Services, Catholic Migration and Refugee Services, U.S. Bishops' Justice, Peace and Human Development Ministry, and the Holy Father's Relief Fund. These agencies touch the lives of more than 100 million brothers and sisters all over the world annually.

This annual CRS collection is different from the traditional Lenten Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowl. The alms we contribute through Rice Bowl provide funding for specific projects while the annual CRS collection provides basic funding for the Catholic agencies. Thank you for your generous spirit.

St. Paul's Question of the Week

Question to the editor: Dear editor, how can we practice Almsgiving during Lent?

Almsgiving is one of the three traditional practices of the season of Lent; prayer, and fasting are the other two. Almsgiving is contributing financially to those in need. Some parishes employ a means whereby the donation is given to assist the parish in the care of the poor. Here at St Paul's, we do the Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowl collection, Good Sam does a Lenten Food Drive, and the School of Religion and Confirmation programs will also do their own Lenten Collections. However, everyone has the ability to relieve the needs of those who are underprivileged through their local parish, diocesan or community shelters and soup kitchens. This can be done through a monetary or material contributions. When we give up certain foods, things and activities for Lent, the money we would have spent on those foods or things should be kept and then put together and given to the poor or to those in need during Easter. In effect, each person can do their own individual Lenten collections. Individuals can also decide to donate more to their weekly church contributions.

From the John Walsh Library

Mauriac, Francois Woman of the Pharisees

This is one of the classic works of fiction in the John Walsh Library. Francois Mauriac, winner of the Nobel Prize for Literature, was preoccupied with the conflict he found between flawed human nature and the goodness of God who promised salvation and eternal life. In this novel, he creates a vivid portrait of a self-righteous woman whose rigid religious principles lead her to interfere disastrously in the lives of others. Allowing no room for human frailty, she is certain she is doing God's will as she manipulates the people around her. But she acts out of vindictive zealotry, not love or compassion. A conscientious teacher, a saintly priest, her husband and stepdaughter, and an innocent schoolboy all become victims to her rigid idea of "perfection." As we strive for spiritual growth during this Lenten season, we need to guard against a smug belief in our own moral superiority. (Call No. FIC-MAU)
