



My sisters and brothers, Jambo! Thank you for coming to celebrate Easter at St. Paul's Church. Indeed, this is the day the Lord has made, and we need to rejoice for our Savior has risen from the dead. The tomb is empty! Now we can sing, Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to the people of good will. St. Augustine is reminding us, "We are an Easter people, and Alleluia is our song." Mary Magdalene, Peter, and the beloved disciple encountered the empty tomb. Mary Magdalene who was the first to see the resurrected Jesus was told by the angel, "Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here for He has been raised as He said" (Matthew 28:5-6).

The angel had told the shepherds on Christmas day similar words, "Do not be afraid, for behold! I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For today in the city of David a Savior has been born for you who is Messiah and Lord" (Luke 2:10-11). The Incarnation and the Paschal Mystery were part of God's saving love for us. The Resurrection is the victory of Jesus' self-sacrificing love. Where there is love sacrifice is easy. "Jesus' perfect sacrifice becomes the source and model for the love of Christians" (Mary Healy). St. Augustine says, "Love and do what you will."

Because of Jesus' resurrection, suffering and death has no power over us. What happened to Jesus is meant to happen to us. The Church and Scripture teaches that the resurrection of Jesus is the foundation of our Christian faith. The resurrection scatters the shadows of darkness and death causing the radiance of light and eternity shine on us. The resurrection recreates us and gives us new hope. During His encounters with the disciples after the resurrection, Jesus greeted them, "peace be with you." This greeting was not just comforting words but also a reassurance that He had conquered sin and death.

Now because Jesus is risen, with joy we can decorate Easter eggs and share in giving baskets of candy. The Easter Bunny can replace Santa Claus in giving gifts. And the angel has the same message for us, "Do not be afraid, Jesus is risen from the dead." So, through our pain and sickness, through our sorrows and sadness, through our hopes and dreams, God is ever present at our side, to see us through to victory.

Today when we receive the Most Holy Communion, we can talk to Jesus because He is alive. Not even death could keep Him from us. So mighty is God's saving love that can't be defeat by sin. Let us ask the Risen Lord to grant us joy, peace, and hope. From here go and proclaim to all the people that the tomb is empty. The empty tomb is there to prove our Lord and Savior lives. And because He lives, we can now face the future with hope. And life is worth living not just because we live here in Webster but because Jesus lives.


Eucharistic Revival Speaker Series
