



The Council should reflect parish membership. Members should be inclusive of the demographic realities of the community (e.g., gender, age minority, persons with disabling or handicapping conditions, etc.) This does not mean that members represent a particular constituency, but rather that the Council should reflect the diversity of the parish.

The Council's primary gift is practical wisdom. The Council is made up of parishioners who have vested interest in the life and development of the parish and want to help the pastor (or pastoral administrator) in this regard. The Pastoral Council is not a group of professionals expert in catechesis, liturgy pastoral care or education.

Council members must meet the following criteria:

- Be fully initiated Roman Catholics in good standing with the Church;
- Be registered and supporting members of the parish;
- Be participants in parish life and worship;
- Be committed to prayer, study, listening and dialogue;
- Be committed to giving the time needed for participation
- Be aware of and comply with the parish by-laws;
- Be aware of and comply with Parish Conflict of Interest Policy.

In addition, he or she should possess the following gifts necessary for pastoral leadership:

- A desire for spiritual growth in oneself and in the parish;
- Eagerness to participate in parish decisions about its direction;
- Willingness to listen, speak openly and honestly, and to work toward consensus;
- Integrity in articulating what one has heard and what one believes;
- The ability to inspire and empower others and to delegate; and
- Cooperation, flexibility and openness with people and ideas.

Murphy, Charles M. <u>Reclaiming Francis</u> (How the Saint and the Pope are Renewing the Church)

With the recent death of Pope Francis, this book is a reminder of why he chose the name Francis. A pope selects his name to announce his vision for his pontificate. Pope Francis once explained his name choice: "For me, Francis was the man of poverty, the man of peace, the man who loved and protected all creation. . .How I would love a Church which is poor and is for the poor." Pope Francis felt this was the way by which the Church would be rebuilt. In his own lifetime, St. Francis inspired what is generally recognized as the greatest spiritual renewal the Church had ever experienced in her long history. He achieved this astounding renewal because his personal holiness was founded on poverty of spirit and resistance to the prevailing culture of the time. Msgr Murphy explores the similarities of the world of St. Francis and of our own. He also examines the priorities of Christ that Francis embodied: the preferential love of the poor, care for creation, and the pursuit of peace. (Call No. 248-MUR)
