

Seeds for the Journey

Come Holy Spirit Fill the Hearts of thy Faithful and Enkindle in them the fire of thy love.

Today, our Holy Mother the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Pentecost. **The Solemnity of Pentecost occurs 50 days after Easter.** Because Easter does not have a fixed date, Pentecost depends on the timing of Easter and can fall anywhere between May 10 and June 13. **Pentecost brings the Season of Easter to an end.** On Monday, we return to Ordinary Time – that time of the year not dedicated to any Liturgical season. It is that part of the year in which Christ the Lamb of God, walks among us and transforms our lives. The US Bishops' Conference website describes Ordinary Time as "a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are caught up in Christ."

Today's celebration is focused on the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the Third Person of the Trinity. Our God is a Trinitarian God – three persons in One God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Today, we recall the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles, after Jesus had ascended into Heaven. Before 'going up to Heaven,' Christ promised sending the Holy Spirit to his followers. As followers of Jesus, we too receive the Holy Spirit, especially when we received the Sacrament of Confirmation. Today is a great day to recall our Confirmation, when we received the outpouring of gifts of the Holy Spirit – Wisdom, Knowledge, Understanding, Counsel, Piety, Fortitude, Fear of the Lord. The Sacrament of Confirmation completed the grace we received at our Baptism; it made us soldiers of Christ and adults in the faith. Consequently, we are called to witness to Jesus every day by what we say and do.

Today more than ever, we need to be more aware and deliberate when we profess our belief in the Holy Spirit when we recite the Creed. The Spirit has been revealed and given; we should recognize and welcome the Holy Spirit as a person. **Today is traditionally recognized as the Birthday of the Church.** On the first Pentecost, after receiving the Holy Spirit, the apostles were no longer afraid. They went out and proclaimed that Jesus is Lord. On that first Pentecost, when Peter preached, about three thousand persons became followers of Jesus and were baptized on that day (Cf. Acts 2:41). Today is a special day to reconnect with the Holy Spirit and pray for any of the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit. Together let us pray:

"Come Holy Spirit fill the hearts of thy faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love.

Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created, and thou shall renew the face of the earth.

O God who taught the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit. Grant that by the gifts of the same Holy Spirit we may be always truly wise and ever rejoice in consolation. Through Christ our Lord Amen."



St. Paul's Question of the Week

Dear editor, who is referred to as the Holy Spirit? What are the fruits of the Holy Spirit? Does the Holy Spirit have other titles? Are there any symbols of the Holy Spirit?

Dear reader, thank you for your prompt question as we celebrate Solemnity of Pentecost today. The name 'Holy Spirit,' is the proper name of the Third Person of the Trinity. The Trinity is the doctrine that teaches that there are three persons in One God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit has been referred to as the Paraclete by Jesus. Paraclete means "he who is called to one's side." This could also mean advocate or consoler. Our Blessed Lord also called the Holy Spirit the "the Spirit of Truth."

In the New Testament, we find the various titles used for the Holy Spirit: the Spirit of Promise, the Spirit of Adoption, the Spirit of Christ, the Spirit of the Lord, the Spirit of God and the Spirit of Glory.

There are twelve fruits of the Holy Spirit: kindness, modesty, patience, joy, charity, self-control, faithfulness, gentleness, goodness, chastity, patience, generosity.

The following are the symbols of the Holy Spirit:

- Water – it signifies the Holy Spirit's action in Baptism.
- Anointing. The symbolism of anointing with oil also signifies the Holy Spirit. Anointing is the sacramental sign of Confirmation.
- Fire – it symbolizes the transforming energy of the Holy Spirit's actions.
- Cloud and Light. These two images occur together in the manifestations of the Holy Spirit.
- The Seal. It indicates the indelible effect of the anointing of the Spirit in the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders.
- The Hand. It is through the apostles' imposition of hands that the Holy Spirit is given.
- The Finger. It is by the finger of God that Jesus cast out demons.
- The Dove. The Holy Spirit came on Jesus at his Baptism in the form of a dove. Likewise, the Spirit comes down and remains in the purified hearts of the baptized.
