


Seeds for the Journey

CMA...... I bet 80% of you just groaned when you read those 3 letters. It's almost over.... I Promise! As of today (5/223) St. Paul's is \$7,925.00 short of our \$105,000 ask; 90% of the way there! That's an A- in my book... not too shabby I say to the 307 families that have donated.

The questions I hear most is Where does the money go? Why is there a collection...... Well, the Diocese of Rochester is among a handful of dioceses in the United States that do not have a formal cathedraticum, an annual diocesan tax on all parishes; many dioceses have both an annual appeal and a cathedraticum. Like many other of our sister dioceses that conduct annual appeals, goals are established to ensure they can adequately and accurately plan for and fund the many charitable ministries and vital services to parishes throughout our 12-county Diocese. Such as....


- •Help pay for the education of our seminarians on the road to priestly ordination.
- •Help fund the crucial work of Catholic Charities, which serves more than 250,000 people.
- •Support ministries that reach out with aid to the aged, the sick, and the imprisoned.



Of the 89 faith communities in the Diocese of Rochester we don't have the lowest ask....That's St. George with a \$3,000 goal. BUT we also don't have the highest.... St. John of Rochester "wins" that with a \$274,000 CMA goal. 53 parishes have reached a higher percentage of their goal and we are better off than 36 communities.

An A- is good... but ST. PAUL'S IS GREAT! And I believe in us! I think we can reach the \$105,000 goal without having to use parish funds. If you haven't given... Please give... If you can give more... Please give, either to the CMA directly or to the CMA shortage here at St. Paul's. Envelopes for both are located on the table in Narthex. Dear editor, what are the essential properties of the Sacrament of Marriage?

Dear reader, there are two essential properties of the Sacrament of Marriage: unity and indissolubility. Unity refers to monogamy: one man commits himself for life to one woman and vice versa. According to Cardinal Kasper: "the act in which the bride and groom give and receive each other is in itself an inner tendency towards definitiveness and exclusiveness" (Kasper, *The Theology of Christian Marriage*, p.45). Anything other than monogamy is contrary to the plan of God because it is contrary to the equal personal dignity of men and women who in matrimony give themselves with a love that is total and therefore unique and exclusive.

The second essential property of marriage is indissolubility. Like unity, it also arises from the very nature of marriage as willed by the Creator. The Church's current understanding of the indissolubility of marriage is presented in Pope Saint John Paul II's Apostolic Exhortation, on the Role of the Christian Family in the Modern World, Familiaris Consortio, "Being rooted in the personal and total-self giving of the couple, and being required by the good of children, the indissolubility of marriage finds its ultimate truth in the plan that God has manifested in His revelation: His wills and He communicates the indissolubility of marriage as a fruit, a sign and a requirement of the absolutely faithful love that God has for man and that the Lord Jesus has for the Church" (n. 20). Since the indissolubility belongs to the essential nature of marriage, as established by God, every valid marriage, either natural or sacramental marriage, is indissoluble and cannot be dissolved by any human power. A marriage that is ratified and consummated cannot be dissolved by any human power or by any cause other than death. However, under certain conditions, a nonsacramental marriage and a marriage that has not been consummated can be dissolved.
