

Seeds for the Journey

Christus Vincit, Christus Regnat, Christus Imperat

Dear People of God, every last Sunday of the Church's liturgical calendar, our Holy Mother, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Universal King. This feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925, with the publication of his Encyclical Letter Quas Primas ("In the First"), as a response to the growing secularism and atheism in the world. At the time, Mussolini had just come to power in Italy, and fascist movements were emerging around Europe. Pope Pius XI wanted to say that there is no human figure to whom our allegiance is due. Rather, Christ is King. Pope Pius XI recognized, that attempting to "thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law" out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. This Solemnity reminds us that while governments and public officials come and go, Jesus Christ reigns as King forever. This reminds me of an antiphon we used to sing at my middle and high school during Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction: Christus Vincit, Christus Regnat, Christus Imperat -Christ Conquers, Christ Reigns, Christ Commands. This is the message that resonates in the Church on the Solemnity of Christ the Universal King. Pope Pius XI gave Catholics hope that Christ the King shall reign forever despite the militantly secularistic regimes that threatened not just the Church and its faithful but civilization itself. Christ's death on the cross overcame the darkness that consumed humankind because of the very fact that He is the Son of God who reigns over all things. In today's second reading, St Paul, in his Letter to the Colossians reminds us that "Christ is before all things and in him all things hold together...For in Christ, all the fullness was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile all things."

In his 2009 Angelus address on the Solemnity of Christ the King, Pope Benedict XVI said among other things: "the mystery of Jesus Christ's death and Resurrection lies at the heart of this process of the revelation of his kingship." Christ's power as King is not that of domination or of pride. Christ's kingly power, as Pope Benedict XVI beautifully puts it, is "the divine power to give eternal life, to liberate from evil, to defeat the dominion of death. It is the power of Love that can draw good from evil, that can melt a hardened heart, bring peace amid the harshest conflict and kindle hope in the thickest darkness." The Jewish leaders mocked him as we read in today's Gospel pericope: "He saved others, let him save himself if he is the chosen one, the Christ of God." Even the soldiers ridiculed him: "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself." You can imagine that even one of the criminals who was crucified with Jesus reviled him saying: "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us." However, the other criminal was able to see the light that Christ's power is not exercised like the temporary power of the earthly kings; he therefore rebuked the other criminal saying: "have you no fear of God?" Like the latter, we too are called to recognized Jesus' kingship exemplified by his humility and self-giving on calvary. Pope Pius XI in *Quas Primas*, calls us to acknowledge Christ's kingship with our whole lives. The deepest allegiances of our hearts should belong to Christ and not any earthly ruler or culture. This feast reminds that Christ alone is king.

As followers of Christ, we are called to listen to what Jesus has communicated to us. It can be summarized by the double love command to love God wholeheartedly and to love our neighbor. As Pope Benedict XVI states, "Choosing Christ does not guarantee success according to the world's criteria but assures the peace and joy that he alone can give us." Jesus wants to be king of our lives. However, he would not subject us to his kingship by force because he is not a tyrannical leader. Jesus is a loving king who desires that which is best for all. He is inviting us today to serve him as king. This means loving Him, obeying God's commandments but also loving our brothers and sisters in the community.

Nouwen, Henri J.M. <u>Life of the Beloved</u> (Spiritual Living in a Secular World)

Father Nouwen informs us this book is the fruit of a longstanding friendship with a reporter for the New York Times who arrived in his office somewhat reluctantly one day in order to interview him. Nouwen sensed this was a man full of gifts, anxiously searching for a way to use them. The two men were quite conscious of their radically different religious backgrounds: a secular Jew and a Catholic priest, but they became close friends. One day, the reporter asked him "Why don't you write something about the spiritual life for me and my friends?" He persuaded Nouwen about the need for a spirituality that speaks to men and women in a secularized society. This book is the result of that request, but ultimately the audience for this book turned out to be searching Christians, not skeptics. In His mysterious way God had used his secular friends to instruct His disciples. (Call No. 248.4-Nou)
