Christ is our King!

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Jesus is King because He is God, the Second Person of the Trinity. Jesus existed from all of eternity. He is the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. Jesus's kingship is not about earthly domination or dictatorship. At the heart of Jesus's kingship is love. Jesus loved us so much that he won salvation for us by his death on the cross. He willingly sacrificed his life for our sins. It is a Kingship of complete self-giving and outpouring of life. Jesus invites us into a relationship with God, where God takes center of our lives. Today's world offers pleasure, money, fame. As Christians, the world offers us too many distractions, such that we may not take our Christian life as seriously as we should. Sometimes, coming to Mass is only secondary; we may forget to pray; we may abandon our Christian obligations. Today's celebration is a reminder that we should bring back Jesus as the center of our daily lives. Jesus is our only King; not the things of the world that distract us. This relationship with God should be seen in the way we treat our brothers and sisters in the community. In today's Gospel, we are told that those who will inherit Jesus's Kingdom are those who feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, welcoming the stranger, clothing the naked, caring for the ill, visiting those in prison; by doing these things to others, we are doing these for Jesus. The Church refers to these as the corporal works of Mercy.

Jesus wants to be king of our lives. However, he would not subject us to his kingship by force because he is not a tyrannical leader. Jesus is a loving king who desires that which is best for all. He is inviting us today to serve him as king. This means loving Him, obeying God's commandments but also loving our brothers and sisters in the community. By doing this, we shall spend eternity with Him in the Kingdom of Heaven. Let us reflect on the Refrain of the song 'The King is Coming":

> O the King is coming The King is coming I just heard the trumpets sounding And now His face I see O the King is coming The King is coming Praise God, He's coming for me.

Hoffman, Alice The Dovekeepers



Nearly two thousand years ago, nine hundred Jews held out for months against armies of Romans on Masada, a mountain in the Judean desert. According to the ancient historian Josephus, two women and five children survived. Hoffman's novel weaves fact and fiction in telling the stories of four extraordinarily bold, resourceful, and sensuous women, each of whom has come to Masada by a different path. Yael's father never

forgave her for her mother's death in childbirth; Revka watched the murder of her daughter by Roman soldiers; Aziza was raised as a boy to become a fearless rider and expert marksman; Shirah is wise in the ways of ancient magic and medicine. Their stories are ones of sacrifice, endurance, and above all, survival. This book is a tribute to anyone who has ever held fast to their beliefs in the face of nearly insurmountable adversity.
