

What is Liturgy?

What do you think of when you hear the word liturgy? I suspect the response most people will offer is the Mass, during which we celebrate the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. There is however, a more general meaning to the word liturgy which lends itself to other liturgical celebrations in the Church. Liturgy is an encompassing term that refers to the set of rituals and prayers foundational to public worship in the Church. As a structured form of communal worship, it includes prayers, scripture readings, perhaps a reflection or homily, and music that enable the congregation to actively participate in the life of the Church. The Mass is a form of liturgy, albeit, the most preeminent form of liturgy in the Catholic Church.

The word liturgy is derived from the Greek word *leitourgia*, which is most commonly translated as "the work of the people." In the history of the Church, it came to mean the participation of the people of God in the work of God (CCC 1069). To paraphrase theologian Edward Kilmartin, liturgy is a communal exercise of one's life of faith in the name of Jesus, a public act of faith in which the faithful affirm their fidelity to God and one another.

Liturgy, however, is more than a gathering of the faithful for prayer and thanksgiving. As Msgr. Guido Marini states in the Vatican document *To Enter into the Christian Mystery Through the Rites and Prayers*, "the Liturgy deals with a celebration by which we truly enter into a relationship with the mystery of our salvation, with Christ the Lord, the Savior, Who communicates His very own life to us – His grace." Liturgy, then, is the action of Christ, in, with, and through the Church, who, through the power of the Holy Spirit, is present to us in words, gestures, music, and rituals. But that presence is more than a static one, it is a real and transformative presence. A presence that engages us and draws us personally and communally into the very mystery of our salvation. As the Catechism states, "Christian liturgy not only recalls the events that saved us but actualizes them, makes them present" (CCC 1104).

Liturgy is, by its very nature, a human action inspired by the Holy Spirit in which we offer glory and praise to God for his saving grace, and the action of Christ who makes himself present, enabling us to participate in His ongoing act of salvation. Nowhere is this most profoundly accomplished than in the celebration of Mass, a sacred action between Christ and His Church, whereby, the people of God participate in the saving act of Christ's death and resurrection, i.e., the Paschal Mystery. Over the past year we have been exploring the history, theology, structure, and communal aspects of the Mass in our Eucharistic Revival Speaker Series.

There are, however, other forms of public worship, or liturgy, that the people of God engage in throughout what is called the liturgical year; a seasonal unfolding of the mystery of Christ and the lives of the saints, throughout the calendar year. These liturgical acts of worship, together with the Mass, comprise the liturgical life of the Church and enable us to more fully reflect on and participate in the mystery of our salvation, the Paschal Mystery of Christ. They include the sacraments, the Liturgy of the Hours (Divine Office), funerals, ordinations, Eucharistic Adoration, as well as rites of blessings of persons and objects (e.g., churches). Over the next few months, as part of our participation in the Eucharistic Revival, we will be exploring via bulletin articles, some of these liturgical rites of the Church in more detail.


