



This month of October, we are celebrating many things. Every October the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates **Respect Life** month with the first Sunday of October designated as Respect Life Sunday. As Catholics we are called to respect and protect human life in all stages from conception to natural death. Respect Life month gives us a chance to highlight this precious and sacred gift through prayer, reflection, advocacy and service. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops asks us to build a culture of life through selfless and sacrificial Christ-like love and care.

October is **World Mission** month, culminating on World Mission Sunday on October 19th. This year's theme is "Missionary of Hope Among the Peoples." World Mission month is meant to help the Universal Church think about the missions, to pray for missionaries and sacrifice in order to support them and the people they serve.

October is also the month of Our Lady of the **Holy Rosary**. We are called to pray the rosary as an individual, family or groups. We are welcome to come and pray group Rosary on Tuesdays at Noon at the Mary's corner in St. Paul's Church. On Saturday, October 11th, we will pray a group rosary at St. Paul's sign near Hard Road. The world Missionary Rosary designed and promoted by Archbishop Fulton Sheen, former National Director of the Pontifical Mission Societies (TPMS), can be used to pray and seek the intercession of mama Mary for the fruits of the Church's missionary work.

In order to support the mission of the church at a diocesan level, this weekend is designated as St. Paul's **CMA** kick-off. This year's theme: "Together we Bring Hope...and Hope Does Not Disappoint." Our parish 2025-2026 Catholic Ministries Appeal goal is \$108,000. We are all called to be generous in our gifts. Frechette, Richard Haiti (The God of tough Places, the Lord of Burnt Men)

As both a priest and a physician, Father Frechette has carried out his double ministry for many years in settings of extreme poverty, violence, social upheaval, and natural disasters. He ministers to both the spiritual health and the physical health of orphaned children and the needy. He is amazed how the human spirit finds light and hope in the most despairing darkness. Haiti is a land of 80% unemployment where the great majority of people subsist on between \$0.25 and \$2.00 a day. But through all of the heartbreak, there is somehow joy. In this collection of essays, Father Frechette reflects on his experiences in Haiti and the remarkable people he has met there. World Mission Rosary Guide

Theme: Missionaries of Hope Among the Peoples

Biblical Inspiration: "Hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us." (Romans 5:5)

Each October, The Church around the world gathers in prayer and solidarity for the missions. Pope Francis, in his 2025 message for World Mission Sunday, on October 19, summoned us "to set out in the footsteps of the Lord Jesus to become, with Him and in Him, signs and messengers of hope for all, in every place and circumstances that God has granted us to live."

Then he prayed, "May all the baptized, as missionary disciples of Christ, make his hope shine forth in every corner of the earth!"

By praying the World Mission Rosary, we unite ourselves spiritually with missionaries who bring this hope to the ends of the earth, often in places marked by suffering, poverty and persecution. The World Mission Rosary was first promoted in 1951 by Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen, the National Director of The Pontifical Mission Societies in the United States. He envisioned a rosary that would embrace the whole world in prayer, assigning each decade a color representing a region of the world where the Church continues its mission work.

- Green: for Africa, signifying its lush forests and rich natural resources.
- Red: for the Americas, recalling the fire of faith and the blood of martyrs.
- White: for Europe, symbolizing the seat of the Holy Father and the heart of tradition.
- Blue: for Oceania, representing the vast waters surrounding its many islands.
- Yellow: for Asia, evoking the sunrise and the light of the East.



Praying five decades of the Rosary each day with these regions in mind is a concrete way to respond to Christ's call to go and make disciples of all nations and to be missionaries of hope among the peoples.
