

Seeds for the Journey

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross celebrates the Cross as the symbol of our salvation. This instrument seen by some people as a sign of shame, became the life-giving tree that reversed Adams' original sin when he ate from the tree of knowledge of good and evil in the Garden of Eden. Jesus turned the Cross into a symbol of sacrificial love, victory, and life.

The emperor Constantine who made Christianity legal in 313 also eliminated crucifixion as a form of capital punishment. Incidentally, it was vision of the Cross that led to the conversion of Constantine. He was assured in the vision that in the sign of the Cross he would conquer Maxentius, a rival to the throne, and he would become emperor of Rome. Once he gained control of the Roman Empire, he went to the Holy Land with his mother, St. Helena, to discover the places where Jesus lived and died on the Cross. They tried to excavate the Holy Sepulcher and attempted to locate the true Cross of Jesus. Three Crosses were found on the spot.

According to one tradition the inscription lesus Nazarenus Rex Iudaeorum ("Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews") was missing.

St. Helena and St. Macarius, the bishop of Jerusalem, assuming that one was the true Cross of Jesus and the other two belonged to the thieves crucified alongside Jesus, devised an experiment to determine which was the true Cross of Jesus.

The three Crosses were taken to a sick woman who was near death; when she touched the true Cross of Jesus, she was healed. Another tradition indicates that a body of a dead man was brought to the place where the three Crosses were found, and laid upon each cross. The true Cross of Jesus restored the dead man to life.

In celebration of the discovery of the Holy Cross, Constantine ordered the construction of churches at the site of the Holy Sepulcher and on Mt. Calvary. Those churches were dedicated on September 13 and 14, 355, and shortly thereafter the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross began to be celebrated on September 14th.

Todays readings and prayers invites us to contemplate on the Cross as a symbol of healing and everlasting life, "for Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up. So that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life (John 3:14). It is good to venerate the Cross, or Crucifix in our churches and houses and even to wear on a necklace. "Standing by the Cross of Jesus were His Mother..." (John 19:25). Monday September 15th is the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows. In 1814 Pope Pius VII established this Feast to commemorate the union of Immaculate Mary's heart with the Sacred Heart of her Son. Through this union Mary experienced the sorrows of Jesus' entire mission.

Luke 2:35 tells us that when Mary and Joseph presented Jesus in the Temple, Simeon prophesized that "a sword would pierce" Mary's heart. This reflects the Seven Sorrows of Mary: the prophecy of Simeon, the fight to Egypt, the loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple, Mary meeting Jesus on the road to Calvary, Mary at the Crucifixion, Mary receiving her Son's body, and Jesus' burial. In the same way that Mary stood beside Jesus, she now stands beside us as we carry our crosses. Mary and Joseph are united in helping us.

Join Our Choir!

The St. Paul's Church Choir provides support for congregational singing as well as music for meditation. Our repertoire ranges from Latin chant to contemporary styles of music. The Choir sings at the weekend Masses on a rotating basis, i.e., the 4:00 p.m. Saturday Mass one week, the Mass at 9:00 a.m. the following Sunday and the 11:00 a.m. Sunday Mass the week after that. The Choir also sings at a Christmas Eve Mass and at Holy Week Liturgies.

This year the Choir will present A Service of Lessons and Carols on Sunday, December 14 at 3:00 p.m. This program includes music provided by the Choir, congregational singing and Scripture readings which will be proclaimed by parish youth. Our Choir will also participate in the Webster Festival of Choirs on Sun., Nov. 2 at 2:00 p.m.

The "Choir Season" runs from September through June. Rehearsals are on Wednesday evenings from 7:00-8:30 p.m., as well as 30 minutes prior to whatever liturgies at which it is singing. While there are no auditions, members have to sing on pitch in the group and follow directions. While some of our singers have prior musical training, some do not. The Coordinator of Music is happy to provide additional resources (recordings) to help singers learn their choir pieces. Singers who are 18 years and older are welcome to join the Choir. Our first rehearsal of the season will be on Wednesday, September 10 from 7:00-8:30 p.m. in the Music Room.




