

Seeds for the Journey

Come to me all you who labor and are burdened (Matthew 11:28)

Dear friends, this Sunday is Catechetical Sunday. This year's Catechetical Sunday's theme is derived from Matthew's Gospel account. Jesus said: "come to me all you who labor and are burdened" (Mt. 11:28). Chapters 11 and 12 of Matthew's Gospel account constitute what biblical scholars refer to as the "missionary instructions." The missionary instructions are the second of the five discourses in the Gospel according to Matthew. These words spoken by Jesus are an invitation for all of us to follow him wholeheartedly.

Catechetical Sunday was initiated as part of a 1935 initiative to recognize and celebrate the gift that catechists give to their parish communities by volunteering their time for the education of children. Catechetical Sunday is an opportunity for all Catholics to re-dedicate themselves to the mission of handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel as a community of faith. Recall that during our faith formation classes while growing up, we were taught that the sacrament of Baptism makes us to be priests, kings and prophets. Consequently, the mission to go out and proclaim the Gospel, the mission to hand on the faith belongs to all who have received the great gift of the Baptism. While celebrating our priest in the parish, our pastoral staff and other catechists who volunteer their time to hand on the faith, we too should ask ourselves if we follow Jesus unhesitatingly or if we live out our prophetic mission given to us at our Baptisms.

During the summer some minor changes were made to our pastoral staff. Our revamped pastoral formation team has been brainstorming over the summer. Every second Sunday of the month beginning October 8, St. Paul shall offer Bible studies from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. This is a great opportunity for us to deepen our understanding of the Word of God. St Jerome is noted for saying that 'Ignorance of the Scriptures is Ignorance of Christ.' This academic year, we are introducing some new programs for our School of Religion and Confirmation classes. We wish to encourage you to spread the word; kindly encourage your kids, grandkids, nephews, nieces, children of your relatives and friends to join our programs which will help develop their faith leading to a better relationship with God and the Church community. We are also planning to re-introduce Children's Liturgy of the Word during the 9:00 a.m. Mass on Sundays beginning in October on a date to be decided. The parish has also planned some wonderful activities as we continue with the Eucharistic Revival in the diocese. We encourage you to attend. These activities are geared towards deepening our faith, a greater appreciation of the gift and mystery of the Eucharist and developing a deeper and genuine reverence for the Eucharist. We also wish to encourage you to be a catechist. Even if you cannot afford to help out every Sunday, you can help us either as an 'alternate catechist' or as a 'substitute catechist' for our School of Religion. We need you!

During the 9:00 a.m. Mass on Sunday, Fr Paul is going to bless the pastoral staff and the catechists. Let us pray for our catechists that they may carry out their mission to educate the children following the mind and heart of Christ and his Church. Kindly join me in saying this prayer for our catechists:

"May God our Father, the Father of Love, fill our parish catechists with confidence and joy as they proclaim the Goodnews of Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit. Amen."

St. Paul's Question of the Week

Dear editor, who is a catechist? What is the role and function of a catechist?

The word 'catechist' is an adjective of the noun 'catechesis.' The word catechesis is from the Greek word meaning 'to echo.' **The goal and object of catechesis is Jesus Christ.** This means catechesis is centered around Jesus Christ.

All those who teach in the Church's name and about Jesus by the way they live are catechists. Anyone who teaches the catholic faith and shares the Church's teaching is a catechist. In this light therefore, parents, grandparents and guardians are also catechists. In fact, parents are the first and primary teachers of the faith for their children. The family, as we probably know, has been described as the domestic Church. This is because through Baptism and education in the faith, the child is introduced into God's family which is the Church (Familiaris Consortio number 15). This introduction by teaching the child how to pray, bringing the child to attend Mass, teaching the child about Jesus, teaching the child about the saints, teaching the child about morals is primarily done by the parents, grandparents and guardians. They are all catechists.

In a more formal way, all bishops, priests and deacons are catechists, pastoral associates, Religious educators, faith formation directors and coordinators, pastoral assistants, theology teachers in catholic schools, parish school of religion teachers are all catechists. The role of the catechist first and foremost is to be close to Jesus as a disciple and secondarily to be a witness and to accompany others. This means that the catechist's life should be exemplary.

(Mealtime Prayers for Family Occasions Throughout the Year)

A brief prayer before dinner is an opportunity to stop and remember God's presence in our lives, to be grateful for His gifts to us, and to remember those in need. That moment of calm before we enjoy our meal sets a tone of gratitude and calls us to think briefly about the person whose hand is in ours as we pray. The mealtime prayers offered in this book offer prayers for the days of the week, including Super Bowl Sunday and other momentous occasions; prayers for the seasons of the church year, such as Christmas and Easter; prayers to celebrate visits and birthdays and first days of school; to honor saints and guardian angels and ordinary working people. When we pray and eat, Jesus is truly present with us. (Call No. 242-HAM)

Confirmation Prep Registration

Registration for the Confirmation Preparation Program at St Paul's Church is now open. Confirmation preparation in the Diocese of Rochester is a two-year formation program that begins in 8th grade and is geared at helping the candidates in their faith development as well as helping them to understand the basic teachings of the Catholic Church. Any potential candidate can begin the program later than 8th grade.

The instructional content includes: an understanding of Confirmation as a Sacrament of Initiation with special connections to Baptism and First Eucharist; an understanding of the role of the Holy Spirit in the life of the individual and of the Church; a greater awareness of the person of Jesus Christ and his teachings as found in Scripture; an understanding of the importance of social justice; an understanding of the Catholic Church: its Divine origin, sacraments, doctrines, history and hierarchical structure; an understanding of the moral teachings of the Catholic Church including the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes; an understanding of the structure of the Mass and the manner for participating in it; an understanding of prayer and its importance in our lives; a working knowledge of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*; an understanding of Christian vocations.

To register, you may complete the form on the website: Confirmation/St. Paul's Roman Catholic Church (stpaulsrcc.org) or you may collect the Confirmation registration form on the Bulletin Board across from the parish office. The fee is \$50 per candidate. Payments can be made in checks payable to St Paul Parish, memo: Confirmation or in cash at the parish office.
