

St. Paul's Question of the Week

Dear editor: "What is the history between good angels and bad angels? Are some angels higher than others?"

Angels are spiritual, non-corporeal beings. They are servants and messengers of God. According to St Augustine, angel is the name of their office and not their nature. They are referred to as angels by what they do and not by who they are. By nature, they are 'spirit.' Like humans, angels have intelligence and will. However, they are immortal. Angels have been present since creation and throughout the history of salvation.

There are good and bad (fallen) angels. Scripture calls the leader of the fallen angels 'Satan' or the 'devil.' The fallen angels were created good by God. However, through their own doing, they became bad. These fallen angels, using their free will, radically and completely rejected God. Of all angels, the most wonderful for God's glory was Lucifer which mean 'bearer of light.' Instead of blessing God, Lucifer became very proud of himself and began to think of himself as God. He refused to obey God and had other angels to join him, and he led a revolt against God. The Book of the Apocalypse tells us that 'War broke out in heaven; Michael and his angels battled against the dragon' (Rev 12:7). The First Letter of John describes the devil as having 'sinned from the beginning' (1 Jn 3:8). In the Gospel of John, Jesus refers to the devil as 'a murderer from the beginning and the father of lies.' There is no repentance for these bad angels after their fall.

The good angels on the other hand, have remained faithful to God. They continue to serve God and act as messengers. These good angels work together for the benefit of us all. The Church broadly celebrates two kinds of (good) angels: Archangels and Guardian angels. The Archangels are known by the names Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. Their feast day is September 29. These are the only angels named in Sacred Scripture and all three have important roles in the history of Salvation. Michael is the leader of the angels and the leader of the army of God. Combatting Satan, the leader of the fallen angels, is one of his main responsibilities. St Michael is invoked for protection especially against enemies. After Lucifer's rebellion against God, Angel Michael called the good angles to join him against Lucifer and his wicked angels and a great battle took place. Michael and his good angels drove Lucifer and the wicked ones into hell. Archangel Gabriel is mentioned both in the Old and New Testaments. Gabriel is the angel who announced both the births of John the Baptist and of Jesus. Archangel Raphael appears by name only in the Book of Tobit. Raphael's name means 'God heals.' St Raphael is the patron saint of travelers, bodily ills, nurses, physicians, medical workers.

The Guardian angels are those given charge of humans. They guard and protect us and inspire us with good thoughts. Our Guardian angels are always near us. Each of us has a Guardian angel into whose care God gave us, because God loves us so much. Their feast day is October 2.

Rolheiser, Ronald <u>Forgotten Among the Lilies</u> (Learning to Love Beyond Our Fears)

The author contends that we go through our days too preoccupied, too compulsive, too driven, and too dissatisfied to be able to be really present to and to celebrate our own lives. Somehow, we seem to be missing out on appreciating the life we actually live. We live in fear of loss; we live in guilt about things we have done or have not done. We seem to be filled with longing and hopeless aching. Father Rolheiser offers down-to-earth guidance for leaving our fears, anxieties, and guilt "forgotten among the lilies." 
