

# Seeds for the Journey

These questions are so often asked: "Why suffering? Why the Cross?" Why did Jesus become a man of Sorrows who suffered death on the cross? His suffering and death remain a mystery, but it produces life. Jesus said, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit" (Jn 12:24). A mother undergoes the pains of childbirth to bring about new life. Jesus' suffering and death makes resurrection and eternal life possible for us. But we must accept to share in his suffering by dying to self. Jesus was very clear about this, "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny his very self, take up his cross and follow in my footsteps."



We place crosses or crucifixes around our necks, on the walls of our homes, and above the sanctuary of every church. But we can get so used to seeing these crucifixes that they lose the impact on our faith and salvation. This month we have two Feast days to help us reflect on the suffering and the cross. September 14th is The Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This Feast commemorate the discovery of the Lord's real cross by the empress, St. Helena through a healing miracle in 320. Mary, the Sorrowful Mother shared Jesus suffering. John 19:25 says, "Standing by the cross of Jesus were His mother and His mother's sister, Mary of Clopas, and Mary Magdala." Hence on September 15, we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows.

There are Seven Sorrows of Our Lady taken from the Scripture events: The prophecy of Simon (Lk 2:34-35); The flight into Egypt (Mt 2:13-21); The loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple (Lk 2:41-50); The meeting of Jesus and Mary on the Way of the Cross (Jn 19:17, Lk23;27); The Crucifixion of Jesus (Jn 19:18-30); The taking down of the Body of Jesus from the Cross (Jn 19:39-40); The Burial of Jesus (Jn 19:39-42). Mary promised through St. Bridget that those who meditate on these Seven Sorrows and prayed Hail Mary seven times:

"I will grant peace to their families; they will be enlightened about the divine mysteries; I will console them in their pains and I will accompany them in their work; I will give them as much as they ask for as long as it does not oppose the adorable will of my divine Son or the sanctification of their souls; I will defend them in their spiritual battles with the infernal enemy and I will protect them at every instant of their lives; I will visibly help them at the moment of their death; they will see the face of their mother; I have obtained from my divine Son, that those who propagate this devotion to my tears and sorrows, will be taken directly from this earthly life to eternal happiness since all their sins will be forgiven and my Son and I will be their eternal consolation and joy."

September 8 is the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. What birthday gift will you give her?

#### St. Paul's Question of the Week

Dear editor, why do we celebrate the Eucharist? What does the Eucharist celebrate?

Dear reader, thank you for your question. The church celebrates the Eucharist because of Jesus' command to repeat his words and actions 'until he comes.'

At the Last Supper, after the breaking of the bread and the distribution of the cup, Jesus asked the apostles to 'do this in memory of me.'

The church has been faithful to the Lord's command from the beginning. The Book of Acts of the Apostles reports that the early Christian community celebrated the Eucharist (Acts 2:42, 46).

When we celebrate the Eucharist,

We remember love that was shared, life poured out. Christ died on the cross for love of us. God loves us so much that God sent God's only Son. Christ died for our salvation.

The Eucharist celebrates the Ritual Meal Christ celebrated with the Apostles. The Eucharist was celebrated in the context of the Jewish Passover.

The Eucharist is a re-enactment of the Calvary sacrifice. Christ sacrificed himself for our salvation. When we celebrate the Eucharist, we re-live in an unbloody manner, Christ's sacrifice on the cross.

The Real Presence of Christ. The Church teaches that Christ is fully, wholly, really, substantially present in the Eucharistic species of bread and wine. After consecration, it is no longer bread and wine but Christ's Body and Blood, whole and entire. We refer to this as Transubstantiation. The substance changes but the accidents remain.

The challenge of the Eucharist: Be the Body of Christ. After receiving the Eucharist, we all are challenged to be Christ to the world. We are to be the Body of Christ wherever we find ourselves. The Church is the Body of Christ. Without the Eucharist, there is no Church. When we celebrate the Eucharist, we celebrate the Church as Christ's Body. We celebrate our parish community where we treat each other with love, kindness, forgiveness, respect.

#### **Confirmation Prep Registration**

Registration for the Confirmation Preparation Program at St Paul's Church is now open. Confirmation preparation in the Diocese of Rochester is a two-year formation program that begins in 8<sup>th</sup> grade and is geared at helping the candidates in their faith development as well as helping them to understand the basic teachings of the Catholic Church. Any potential candidate can begin the program later than 8<sup>th</sup> grade.

The instructional content includes: an understanding of Confirmation as a Sacrament of Initiation with special connections to Baptism and First Eucharist; an understanding of the role of the Holy Spirit in the life of the individual and of the Church; a greater awareness of the person of Jesus Christ and his teachings as found in Scripture; an understanding of the importance of social justice; an understanding of the Catholic Church: its Divine origin, sacraments, doctrines, history and hierarchical structure; an understanding of the moral teachings of the Catholic Church including the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes; an understanding of the structure of the Mass and the manner for participating in it; an understanding of prayer and its importance in our lives; a working knowledge of the Catechism of the Catholic Church; an understanding of Christian vocations.

To register, you may complete the form on the website: Confirmation/St. Paul's Roman Catholic Church (stpaulsrcc.org) or you may collect the Confirmation registration form on the Bulletin Board across from the parish office. The fee is \$50 per candidate. Payments can be made in checks payable to St Paul Parish, memo: Confirmation or in cash at the parish office.
